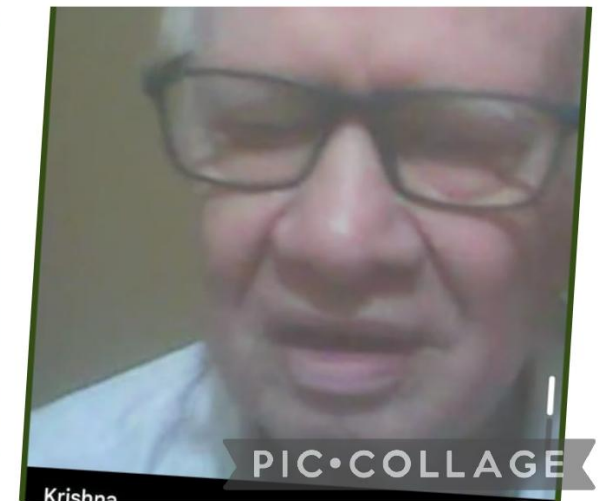
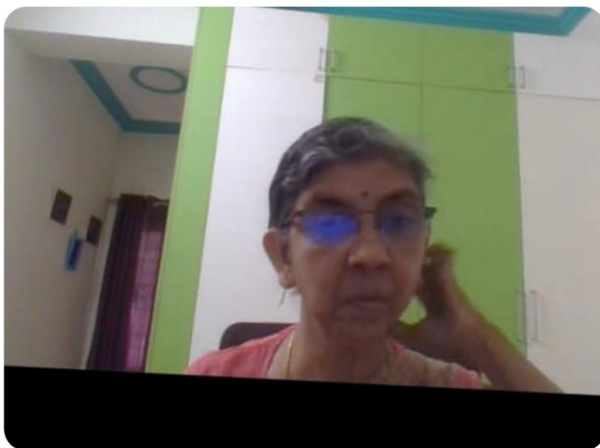

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## Report on One-Day State Level Webinar

**Topic:** *"Maanveeya Samvedna ko Darshati Kahaaniyaan – Muktidhan, Haar, Bhookh Hadtal"*  
(*"Stories that Show Human Emotions"*)

The Department of Hindi, SGA Government Degree College, Yellamanchili, organized a **One-Day State Level Webinar** on *"Maanveeya Samvedna ko Darshati Kahaaniyaan – Muktidhan, Haar, Bhookh Hadtal"* on **24th October 2025**. The webinar aimed to explore the deep human emotions reflected in the selected Hindi stories written by renowned authors.

Two eminent speakers graced the occasion.

- **Dr. S. Krishna Babu**, Retired Deputy General Manager (Rajbhasha), RINL Visakha Refinery; President, WAJA AP; and President, Sanskar Bharathi, AP, delivered an insightful analysis of *"Muktidhan"* written by the celebrated Hindi author **Munshi Premchand**. He highlighted how the story portrays the honesty and kindness of a poor Muslim farmer, Rahaman, which transforms the heart of a stone-hearted Hindu advocate and moneylender. The story beautifully emphasizes religious tolerance and mutual respect among communities.
- **Dr. T. Haimavathi**, Retired Deputy General Manager (Rajbhasha), RINL Visakha Refinery, explained the major themes of *"Haar"* by **Mannu Bhandari** and *"Bhookh Hadtal"* by **Dr. Bala Souri Reddy**.  
In *"Haar"*, Mannu Bhandari presents the emotional conflict of a modern couple contesting against each other in an election. The wife, Deepa, realizing her husband Shekhar's concern for her, ultimately votes for him—depicting the depth of human emotion and mutual understanding in relationships.  
In *"Bhookh Hadtal"*, Dr. Bala Souri Reddy raises a thought-provoking question through the character of a poor woodcutter, Narayan, about the place of uneducated people in a society that values only educated citizens. The story highlights the need for equality, dignity, and recognition of all sections of society.

The webinar was **presided over by Dr. P. Chandra Shekhar**, Principal of SGA Government Degree College, Yellamanchili. **Dr. Chitti Babu**, Senior Lecturer in Commerce, graced the occasion and encouraged participants with his presence.
